- Whereas, UNITED WE SERVE serves as the President's Call to Service in engaging all Americans in service to their communities; and
- Whereas, the National Alliance of Faith and Justice (NAFJ) is a member of the MLK Service Network of the Corporation for National and Community Service; and
- Whereas, in recognition of that spirit, Congress, in 1994, *passed* the King Holiday and Service Act, which directed the Corporation to support local efforts to make the King Holiday a day of service; and
- Whereas, 2014 marks the 50th anniversary of the Civil Rights Act; and
- Whereas, the 10<sup>th</sup> annual national commemoration of Justice Sunday<sup>TM</sup>, observed January 19, 2014, offers cities and communities nationwide a key benchmark in efforts to dismantle inequities, advocate solutions and alternatives to violence, and recognize the selfless service of Dr. King as a clergy and the role of volunteers of diverse faiths in efforts to achieve human dignity and equality and as key stakeholders of social change; and
- Whereas, the theme of Justice Sunday<sup>TM</sup>, "A Charge To Keep We Have: One For All" recognizes service and change as an ongoing and evolving commitment; and
- Whereas, January is National Mentoring Month, and the National Alliance of Faith and Justice through PEN OR PENCIL<sup>TM</sup> and its affiliates, has partnered with the National Association of Blacks in Criminal Justice, the Association for the Study of African American Life and History, and other national organizations in the reinvestment of justice and recognition of civil rights through the expansion of mentoring efforts throughout the continuum; and
- Whereas, NAFJ works in cooperation with the National Park Service to promote civic engagement through service learning, cultural diversity, and historic preservation; and
- Whereas, Justice Sunday<sup>TM</sup> 2014 will serve as a national day of recruitment for faith and community-based, peer, and corporate mentors to help facilitate a pathway to freedom for younger Americans most at risk of violence, delinquency, and school disengagement;
